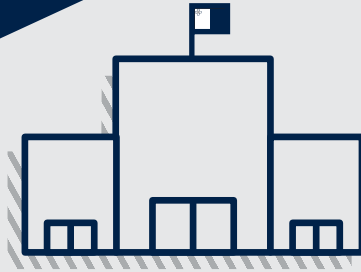




An Energy Audit is an essential tool to understand how energy is consumed and identify opportunities to reduce consumption. Normally costs between €6,000-€7,000.



Scheme is in line with EU policy, the Energy Efficiency Directive and contributes towards Malta's efforts in reaching its national Energy Efficiency target by 2020.



This Government scheme, run by EWA co-finances such audits and is open for Medium and Small Sized Enterprises.



Cooperating with other Government entities to launch new schemes to support measures identified by the audit.



Medium Sized Enterprises can benefit up to €5,000.



Scheme has been tailored in collaboration with Industry, Services and Hospitality Sector, together with the Malta Business Bureau.

Small Sized Enterprises are also eligible as long as their consumption exceeds 75000kWh annually.

Typical benefits from an energy audit:

- Identifies operational changes that may yield significant savings at zero cost e.g. re-calibrating pressure settings in air systems.
- Identifies low hanging fruits, i.e. significant

savings through minimal interventions with a short rate of return e.g. shift to LED lighting

- Identifies new and more energy efficient technology for the respective enterprise.



Scheme is open until December 2019 unless funds are fully utilised earlier.
